## Osco 75th Anniversary Reunion Plans Underway

## Supervalu Cuts 800 Office Positions

Supervalu plans to cut 800 positions nationwide, with the majority of cuts prior to February 25, the date its fiscal year ends. The company has approximately 135,000 employees in total. It said that the majority of the reductions will be complete by the end of February. The cuts include both currently filled and open jobs across most departments within its organization, although store-level employees are generally not affected. After 16 straight quarters of declining same-store sales, this announcement continues Supervalu's strategic plan to remove



permanent expenses from its business as well as reduce overall operating costs, efforts which the company said are necessary toward delivering more competitive pricing to its customers. The announcement affects all company offices and crosses most departments within the organization. In general, store-level employees will not be affected; associates whose positions are eliminated will be eligible for severance and outplacement services. "These reductions are necessary to help further strengthen and accelerate Supervalu's business turnaround in a very competitive marketplace," said



**Craig Herkert**, current Supervalu CEO and president. "While the announcement of a workforce reduction is difficult news to share, due to its direct impact on our associates, these changes will allow us to better connect with customers and put more authority in the hands of people who interact more closely with our customers." About a year ago, Supervalu introduced its strategic vision that focuses heavily on improving its retail business through planned price reductions and an emphasis on hyper-local retailing at its more than 1,100 traditional retail stores across the country.

## One Location, Four Different Drug Stores - in 10 Years

In April 1982, Osco #986 opened in Allston, MA. Prior to the store opening, the location was home to a Chrysler/Plymouth dealership. During transformation of the facility to a drug store, hydraulic lifts in the dealership's service department were not removed - just cemented over. The building also had an auto ramp built into the foundation which also was never removed. This resulted in a little "hill" in the cosmetics department.

At the time of the grand opening (below) **Dave Maher** was regional VP, **Gene Lacey** was store manager, **Bob Cook** was district mgr. and **Jim Holt** was 1<sup>st</sup> asst. mgr. Store employees included those from the



recently closed Osco #952, Winter St. Boston store and from Turn\*Style #902 Brighton, MA which had closed four years earlier. Allston is a neighborhood of Boston, located in the western part of the city and had the typical loss prevention challenges as many inner city stores had at the time, and still have today. It was the first store in the region to have a grocery section with milk, eggs and a small aisle of food. The store's clientele was a combination of the many different ethnic groups that made up the "melting pot" of Allston. Others who worked at the store sometime during their Osco careers include **John Roehm**, **Anthony Accardi**, **Pat Landroche**, **Terry Barton**, **Alina Gagnon**, **Liz Abrantes**, **Enio Casale**, **Jack Hounsell**, **Rob Iapicca** and **Stuart Noyes**.

In 2002 the store became a *Brooks Pharmacy* after the sale of the New England stores. In 2006, once again, ownership and the store name changed to *Rite Aid* when the *Jean Coutu Group* divested their *Brooks Pharmacy* chain.

This summer, *CVS/pharmacy* will take over the space from *Rite-Aid* and open a new 13,000 square-foot convenience store with a drive-thru pharmacy this fall. The spokesman confirmed that rival pharmacy chain *Rite-Aid* plans to vacate the retail spot this spring after the *Rite-Aid* was unable to come to terms with the property's landlord to extend its lease at the location.



Our first store opened on April 17, 1937, in Rochester, Minnesota. It was a difficult economic time. People didn't have a lot to spend, and you had to work hard to get their business. We combined self-service with friendliness toward the customer. We made customers feel welcome and tried to treat them better than any other merchant. Our new drugstore opened in a location that previously was a Piggly Wiggly grocery store. Piggly Wiggly was moving to a location with parking lots away from the main downtown business area. Our new location was not ideal for a drugstore, but the rent was reasonable. The store was wider than it was deep. In the front part of the store, we had a lobby - a service department where we sold such things as cameras, radios, sporting goods, candy, cigarettes and tobacco, and related products of that kind. The remainder of the store (the self-service area) was entered through a revolving gate. The prescription and cosmetic departments were in this part of the store. We carried many more items than the average drugstore. In fact, after a few years, our customers used to say



"Osco has everything." We were the first to have a big assortment of pills on open display. We had, what we called, the pill table. It had aspirin and laxatives and all kinds of pills. People would just mill around and look at the things which had always been behind the counter before. At that time you couldn't buy bagged candy; it was all sold bulk. So we built a fixture and hired a young man to bag the candy. We had about a ten foot assortment. In later stores, we sold popcorn and had lines forming out the door and down the street for that. We sold a six pound size bag for a nickel. We were open from 8 a.m. till 10 p.m. so we had two shifts. Most of the time, I was there from opening to closing. We had a crew of about 10 to 12 people. As manager I would open the store, see that the people came in and were ready for their responsibilities, and then I'd sweep the sidewalk. During the day we would restock the shelves, clean, and usually order merchandise once per week. When merchandise came in, it would go down a chute into the basement where it was checked in by our receiving man and then brought upstairs to be put on the shelves. We did this by hand until conveyors became affordable. We had to spend all of our time on the sales floor. One of the things that made our stores successful was the management pay plan. In the beginning, managers were paid \$30 per week and 30% of profits.





At any given time we have over 50 clients residing in our shelters - 65% are children. We provide a 9 month program in an effort to promote self sufficiency and place them into permanent housing. This year is our 25th anniversary.

Funding HOS shelters and services comes from grants from federal and state agencies, proceeds from our various fundraisers, and revenue from our four thrift stores called the [Sparrow's Nest Thrift Stores](#). I oversee all retail and logistics operations of the agency. Our stores are located in Woodstock, Cary, McHenry and Palatine. The work force in each store is a combination of paid staff and volunteers. Everything that my stores sell is donated. I get to see first-hand how generous the American public is. Something the U.S. is never given enough credit for. I have a fleet of trucks and a logistics team that makes free furniture pickups and brings them to the store for resell as well as moving clients, their children, and their belongings from the shelter to their permanent housing. Behind women's apparel, furniture is my number two volume category. I am actively searching for additional store sites to help grow our great regional thrift store chain which will enable our agency to reduce homelessness



in women and children in Northern Illinois at a faster rate. Our website is [www.HOSparrow.org](http://www.HOSparrow.org) My wife Cindi works as an Activities

Assistant at the Garlands, an assisted living community in Barrington. My oldest son Kyle is a Corporal in the Marines stationed in Okinawa Japan. My next son Brady is an Arizona State graduate working for the *Fresh and Easy* grocery chain in Phoenix - apple doesn't fall far from the tree here! My daughter Kelsie is attending McHenry County Community College and will be wrapping up at Northern Illinois in the fall to become a Medical Lab Technician.


**Dan Zolnowski Retires from Osco**

Today there are shows on TV where the CEO of a company will work incognito somewhere within the organization. At one time, Osco had a policy that members of upper management would spend a few days or a week in one of the stores. Their time in the store allowed them to work in all departments, review merchandise and product flow, and perhaps resolve efficiency issues.

**Dick George**, our president at the time came out to work at the Westdale store in Cedar Rapids. During one of the first weeks that we were open. This was a great opportunity for me and our employees to meet him and also work with him side by side. One of his jobs was to bag for the checkers so that he could meet some of our customers. No job was too big or too small. His first job was to price tag about three hundred cases of toys. I set him up with a marking gun and a box cutter to open the boxes. After less than 20 minutes of marking the toys, he called me to the back room. He said, "It is our policy to place the price tag on the top right hand corner of the box, correct?" I said yes and his comment was this policy is about to change right now. He walked up to our office and called the corporate HQ and changed the policy right on the spot. Today we scan bar codes, but in the late '70s, many hours were spent placing pricing tickets on the required location. No wonder the TV shows are such a hit today. I would bet that many corporate officers today have never spent any time working in any of their stores. If they have they would approach their job in a different manner.

In addition, the company remains focused on investing capital into the growth of Save-A-Lot, its national, hard-discount banner, as well as continuing to expand its wholesale distribution business to its more than 2,000 independent retailers nationwide.

Supervalu Inc. operates a network of 4,300 stores composed of 1,104

traditional retail stores (Jewel-Osco, Shaw's/Star, Acme, Albertsons, Cub, Shoppers, Save-A-Lot), including



798 in-store pharmacies; 1,309 hard-discount stores, of which 922 are operated by licensee owners; and 1,900 independent stores serviced primarily by the company's traditional food distribution business.

### Connections Survey Results *Electronic or Paper?*

As detailed in the August and November 2011 issues of *Connections*, our printing and distribution costs of providing the quarterly newsletters have increased. Instead of raising membership dues to help offset these expenses, we hoped our costs could be contained by printing and mailing the newsletters to only those members who prefer the U.S. Mail delivery method. 
