SUPERVALU UPDATE

Thanks again to Gary Hunstiger for providing us with this update on the latest news from SUPERVALU

It's hard to believe that Fall will be upon us soon! The transformation of SUPERVALU continues to move along at a fast pace as was noted in the 1st Quarter report with nicely improved earnings and sales that were positive albeit below Wall Streets sales expectation. The Boise Shoreline office is nearly empty and the new Merchandising and Marketing office in Eden Prairie, Minnesota will be fully occupied over the next few weeks. Our new facility in Eden Prairie has been named the East View Innovation Center (EVIC), where would we be without acronyms? EVIC is located 5 miles west of the Chanhassen office. The new building will sport a beautiful test kitchen, a 35,000 square foot Lab store and we are reusing the office furniture from Boise.

SUPERVALU continues to shift resources to accommodate the centralization of Center Store, which is comprised, of GM/HBC, Grocery, Total Alcohol Beverage (TAB) and Fuel. Harry Vasconcellos, known to his Osco Drug friends as Vass, passed away on July 25, 2007, at the age of 89 years. Vass grew up in the Des Moines, Iowa area and held a degree in Pharmacy from Drake University. During World War II he served in the United States Army in dietetics, as a pharmacist and as a navigator on B-24's in the European arena. While in the Army he met and married Edythe Anderson on August 12, 1942.

Following his tour of duty, Vass joined his wife in Waterloo, Iowa and was hired by Self Service Drug, Inc., which later became Osco Drug, to work as a pharmacist in their fifth store. He became the manager of that store and trained many of those who were the heart and soul of Osco Drug.

Upon retirement the couple moved to Phoenix, Arizona, where they enjoyed many wonderful years together – celebrating their 64th wedding anniversary in 2006. Edythe died on February 11, 2007. Their final resting place is in Rowley, Iowa.

Factory Card and Party Outlet

Factory Card & Party Outlet began as a division of Gallant Greetings, a greeting card distributor. Gallant kept sample greeting cards in its waiting room as a way for guests to pass time. As requests for the sample cards grew, Gallant began to charge 25 cents each, but it was hardly a formal business: the receptionist placed all funds from card sales in a cigar box.

As the word got out, people would stop by just to purchase cards. The popularity of the sample greeting cards spurred Gallant into forming a new division devoted to that product. J. Bayard Kelly, with nearly 30 years of industry experience, was charged with spearheading the new Factory Card & Party Outlet. The first store opened in 1985 in a 4,000 square foot location in Buffalo Grove, a suburb of Chicago, Illinois.

Kelly secured a number of investors and purchased the company in 1989, with 10 stores in operation. Since going public in 1996, the company has grown to nearly 200 stores in 20 states and an online Web store. From their humble waiting-room beginning, Factory Card & Party Outlet now carries more than 3,000 designs of greeting cards.



Boys and Girls Clubs help kids aim higher

Yaneth Zavala wasn't planning on going to college, but she changed her mind thanks to encouragement from staffers at the Boys and Girls Club in the Little Village neighborhood, where she volunteers helping out younger children.

"It's a great feeling to know these little kids are looking up to you," said Zavala, a high school junior who is thinking about becoming a teacher.

Zavala is one of the youth-of-the-year winners who were recognized during the Boys and Girls Clubs of Chicago's 58th annual summer ball, held Friday evening at the Cadillac Club at Soldier Field. The others honored at the event included Ezekiel Clerk, Vanlisa Evans, Jerrod Harris, Jacqueline Salgado and Marshe Collins, who won the citywide award.

They are among the more than 17,000 children helped each year at the 32 Boys and Girls Clubs of Chicago, which provide health, education, career, arts, leadership, sports and recreation programs. "We're more than just gym and swim," observed **Bob Howard**, the organization's president and chief executive officer. A Chicago native, Howard earned an MBA from Harvard, worked as a senior vice president of the Payless ShoeSource chain and was lured out of retirement in 2002 to lead the Boys and Girls Clubs of Chicago.

As a teenager, Howard played sports and attended dances at a Boys and Girls Club in the Woodlawn neighborhood. "Today it's different. Kids have a lot more pressure on them," he said, noting that 70 percent of the children in the organization's programs are from single-family homes and 70 percent are from families with household incomes of less than \$28,000.

The organization's woman's board hosted the ball. Board chairwoman Linda Gantz and ball chairwomen Lenore Cameron and Barbara Stone greeted guests as they arrived. "The Boys and Girls Clubs are a place where they can feel safe and learn," said Gantz, an 18-year veteran of the board. "They're there when kids are out of school and most at risk," Cameron added.

More than 500 patrons attended the \$500-perperson black tie gala, which began with a cocktail reception and silent auction, followed by a dinner of truffle-crusted filet mignon, summer ratatouille, and a chocolate and strawberry mousse terrine. Veteran television newscaster Bill Kurtis and partner Donna LaPietra led a live auction during dessert, which was followed by dancing to the music of the City Lights Orchestra.

Among the guests were many of the city's business and civic leaders, including Andrew McKenna, whose long list of commitments include chairman of McDonald's Corp., and Schwarz Paper Co., and serving on the Boys and Girls Clubs of Chicago's advisory board.

"It's important to give back to the community.

Those of us who don't [give back] make a mistake," said McKenna, who recently added the post of fundraising chairman for Chicago's bid to host the 2016 Olympic Games to his duties.
